**Re: FUND RAISING REPORT**

In conjunction with celebrating the Malaysian Night 2013 in Tokyo, Japan, we had an idea in organizing a small fund raising activity to:

- (1) Raise the awareness of the Haiyan victims in Leyte and Samar islands of Philippines
- (2) Raise fund in cash term to be channel for the flood relief effort in Panang and Terrenganu

However, it is rather hard for us to do cheque or internet banking from Tokyo. We suggested to:

- 1) Collect in term of cash
- 2) Record information of the donators: Name, and email
- 3) Channel cash from MSAJ to MRC

On 10th December 2013, we wrote an email to Red Crescent(M)-Selangor, seeking permission on the usage of MRC logo/name during the fund raising effort at the Malaysian Night fund raising counter.

On 13th December 2013, we received a formal email from Puan Fatimah, Branch Chairman of RED CRESCENT(M)- SELANGOR entitled "Malaysian Nite 2013 for AID" with updated information on the flood relief effort:-

Red Crescent(M)-Selangor members and volunteers responded to the recent floods in the States of Pahang & Terengganu. Many displaced people were subsequently provided with food and relief assistance.

Newsflash: About 40 members and volunteers comprising of University students and Volunteer-Aid Detachment teams from Red Crescent(M)- Selangor are waiting to be deployed to assist the Red Crescent-Pahang Branch in the recovery phase which include but not limited to the act of cleaning their affected areas/houses for a clean environment and have access to enough safe water and basic necessities for everybody who have returned to their homes from the evacuation centres.


In respect of the Typhoon Haiyan, our member Mr. Khairuddin have just come back after spending 2 weeks assisting the Philippines Red Cross in their distribution of donated items to the survivors during the emergency response phase. They recovered 2 bodies near their camp place. If we receive donations, we will remit to the Philippines Red Cross and our plan is for more of our members to be attached with Philippines Red Cross to continue with their recovery, reconstruction and rebuilding plans. On 15th December 2013, in the MALAYSIAN NIGHT 2013 with the theme of "BY MALAYSIANS, FOR MALAYSIANS!!!" which was held in 大田区産業プラザ(PiO)京急蒲田, with roughly 150 attendees, a fund of JPY 35,116, USD 100, and MYR 50 was collected. A team of 6 volunteer members (Ms. Crystal, Mr. Abul, Mr. Syed, Ms. Nisa, and Mr. Fu Wei lead by me) was formed on the spot in the fund raising effort. Much gratitude to Mr. Ruiz, Mr. Zed and Ms. Fish, the organizing committee of Malaysian Night 2013 in providing this platform for the fund raising activity.

The funds collected during Malaysian Night 2013, was counted and its amount recorded by MSAJ's Treasurer Ms. Bik Ee, together with me. The money will be transferred from MSAJ's bank account to Red Crescent's bank account. A receipt will be issued by Red Crescent (M)-Selangor upon receiving the fund raised from MSAJ. This is to ensure, for both parties, that the money collected during Malaysian Night 2013, is appropriately transacted as agreed.

Together with Red Crescent (M)-Selangor, we will help a stranger "Anytime, Anywhere".
